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Report:

Glen Region members should be proud of the hard work and dedication that we put into our events in making them successes. Our region is currently and has always been on the forefront of the SCCA. From supporting the track in the Grand Prix days, to our own successful Club Racing, Solo, and Rally programs, our region has always strived to try new things, and improve on our existing events.

This year we were honored at the National Convention in a way that we never expected and it was a complete surprise. The Glen Region was named the 2007 recipient of the Tom Burke Award for Outstanding Membership Recruiting. The National office in Topeka has been researching our club's membership demographics. Who is a member of the SCCA, how old, where do we live, what do we do, etc., are areas that are being currently researched. One area of data was the comparison of how many people live in a region's chartered area as compared to how many are members. For example, if a region had a general population of 10,000 people living in the region's area, and 100 of those people were members of the SCCA region, then the region would have a 1% per capita membership of the number of possible members available. The research did not include Dual Members. The Glen Region was #1 in the SCCA with a Base Population of 275,014 people living within the boundaries the region and having 11.53 members per 10,000 people of population. What does this all mean you may ask? Directly this data shows that a high number of the people who live within our region are members of the Glen Region, as compared to other regions of the SCCA. Indirectly, and more importantly, it shows that our hard work at having fun and putting on good events does bring in more members. Folks, we're doing things right!

The 2007 National Convention was a great success with our region being asked to present to the attendees a review of the Green Grand Prix rally, but more on that later. First I want to give you a summary of the Convention and events. This year is the first of three years the convention will be in San Antonio, Texas, with a three-year theme of 2007-Connect, 2008-Adapt, and 2009-Unite.

Coming out of the cloud cover and looking out of the plane's window to see green grass and trees (!!!!) in February was a sight for sore New York eyes. And the locals knew that some northerners had landed when you're walking around outside in 50 degree weather with just a light shirt, while the local folks are bundled up in thermal jackets! San Antonio is a very nice city with quality local folk. Everything IS BIGGER in Texas, and after I got over some the "sticker-shock" prices, things settled down. The region was represented by Tim Meddaugh, Earl Hurlbut, Sandy & Ed Sanders, Ed Jakobus, and myself (making the last three the well known Ed, Edd, & Eddie).

The first session I attended was for new and returning Regional Executives. Mike Dickerson of the National Office presented the duties and responsibilities of the position of RE. It was interesting to see how regions from all over the country divide the responsibilities up. Some operate like our region, and some operate much differently with more committees and levels of structure. Benefits to all types of administrative structures were discussed and presented by the attendees.

The aging and graying of the SCCA is apparently a bit of a myth. The largest amount of new members joining the SCCA is in the 26-35-age range. And the statistics also showed that if a member stayed in the club for more than three years, then they would likely stay a member. Once again it seemed that good events produced good members, who stayed in the club. After that session, the REs met with the Board of Directors and SCCA President Jim Julow in a closed session. The purpose of this session was to be a productive "working session" identifying the strengths and areas that need improvement to our club. One of the outcomes to this working meeting was to define the roles of the President, the Boards of Directors, and Regions, in improving our club. Once again it proved that our strength was in our members and our events. Someone can join SCCA and participate at various levels of involvement in terms of both time and money. The areas of needs were the usual list of the need for more workers, venue locations for our events, securing dates at existing tracks, and the need for more national exposure to the general public (like Speed, magazines, newspapers, etc.). A general open session was next with "Meet the President." As I have said in past REports, we are lucky to have Jim Julow at the wheel. Jim is a down to the tarmac kind of guy who really understands a region's needs as well as the national needs of

Most of the session was on Jim's first year, the changes he has seen, and what he foresees for our future. Jim attended this past fall MiniCon in New Jersey, and if we can get him to attend our March 2008 RoundTable we would be honoured to have him. If you know that Jim is to be attending an event you are at, be sure to walk up and introduce yourself.

The Board of Directors Annual Meeting was next with reports from all areas of the SCCA. Two of the more interesting things to come out of the Annual Meeting were reports that Enterprises (the company the club owns and produces the SRF, FSCCA, etc. cars), is continuing to do well financially. Also, SCCA ProRacing is also on track to be profitable again. The Annual Meeting then became the Town Hall Meeting, where you could ask questions of the Board of Directors. Questions regarding the financial status of ProRacing were brought back to the table, and the board stood firm that ProRacing will be in the black.

Region Development was another session in the series for REs. Presentation of the fine balance in how our regions are both a Club and a Business were covered. Planning for the future and where you hope to have the region in 1, 3, & 5 years are essential to the region's success. The session showed that the Glen Region's long standing practices of budgeting and saving, as well as, putting on good events have led to our success. Getting our names, faces and events out to the general public at an increased level is one area we can continue to grow.

The Region Development: Public Awareness session gave information on why we need to get the word out to the general public. Some of the benefits of Public Awareness are Recognition, Charitable assistance, Social responsibility, New members, New sites, and general publicity. Our region continues to do well in some of these areas, and will continue to work hard at all of them. Having the general public

understand our events will make obtaining sites for programs like our Solo events easier.

The SCCA Foundation has teamed up with the BMW Club's Foundation to increase the number of "Teen Driving Program" events that the BMWCCA is currently operating. The program was presented by Bill Wade of the BMWCCA Foundation. You can check this program out at www.streetsurvival.org for more information. The program that the BMW club has put together is excellent as well as a perfect match for integration into the SCCA. And while the program is currently aiming at larger metropolitan areas, in the future we may want to try to put one together for our neck of the woods.

The Town Hall Meeting of the Club Racing Board has been historically a hot bed of discussion. Much to everyone's surprise, this year's meeting was extremely smooth. Discussions of cars and classes were clarified and all information will (as always) be in Fastrack.

The Region Best Practices: RE Panel Discussion was a great success with the Glen Region being requested to present our Green Grand Prix. The Panel of REs covered areas of new racetracks and how to staff them, new programs such as Time Trials, new venues for solo events, and our Green Grand Prix. Many questions from all over the country were asked of the panel, as the various regions sought out more information on successful and unique events.

Licensing Procedures was the last of the sessions I attended. An overview of the Club Racing and Worker licenses were covered. Changes to the Worker License process have been implemented for 2007. The worker "cards" are now gone and more of the process will be going through the DAs. On the Club Racing Novice licenses, regions can and will still issue Novice Permits. Clarifications as to student who have attended one of the "Professional" schools were discussed. The "Pro" schools do not issue a SCCA license. They issue a certificate and the student still needs to contact SCCA for a regional license. Most important was to remind students to make a copy of all documentation being sent to the national office. The social events of the convention were great as usual. The Rally and Solo Luncheon Sponsored by the Tire Rack, the Club Racing Awards Luncheon Sponsored by Mazda and the Club Awards and Hall of Fame Induction Banquet Sponsored by

The Hall of Fame included Marge Binks, Carl Haas, General Curtis E. Lemay, Theodore F. Robertson and Marc Gerstein. It was great to witness these inductions and especially to see Marc Gerstein, known to so many of us in NeDiv, with his neverending smile.

American Honda were all great events.

The 2007 SCCA National Convention was a success with very good information being shared, new ideas and knowledge being gained, and of course the chance to see old friends. News from the International Motor Racing Research Center in Watkins Glen

Mark Donohue's Eagle in the Spotlight

The 1972 All-American Racers Eagle #7225 now on display at the International Motor Racing Research Center will be the centerpiece of a panel discussion Saturday, March 31.

The car is notable as the Eagle that carried Mark Donohue through his final USAC racing season in 1973.

A panel of experts on the car and on legendary Donohue will lead the discussion that gets under way at 1 p.m. The Center is located at 610 S. Decatur St., Watkins Glen, NY.

The Eagle is owned by the Dresang family and the Utecht family of Hartford, WI. A photo montage and historiography of the Eagle will be presented during the discussion.

The Eagle had a racing life of four seasons before it was ultimately surpassed in technology by the ground-effect cars of the late 1970s. In its time, #7225 was raced by Donohue, Gary Bettenhausen, Bill Simpson, Rick Mears, Steve Krisiloff and Bubby Jones.

Though not a race-winner, #7225 is one of the few public examples of the 1972 generation of AAR Eagles. It has been restored back to its qualifying configuration from Indianapolis in 1973, though the history of its entire career has been respectfully documented as a tribute to the men and women who built and cared for the car during its golden era.

The discussion is part of the ongoing Center Conversations series, a free monthly talk series that takes listeners behind the scenes of motorsports. The talks are informal, and everyone is invited.
