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Specialties: Timing & Scoring

There is one thing the stopwatch cannot do, and that is tell a lie. Welcome to timing and scoring, where we keep the time and make sure that the drivers are in the right position. Those are the basics, but how do we do it? If you have watched a race within the last 20 years, you won't be surprised to learn the timing part is done by computer. Though in the "old days," that was where the stopwatch came in.

In order for the computer to work, it needs a decoder to pick up the transponder hits. A transponder is a little box that has a unique number on every car; that's how we can keep track of all of the cars. We use the same system for races too, but it is not the primary. Per the rules in the SCCA, it is the human eye. We have a group (we can always use more!) to write the car numbers as they pass. These are compiled by one person onto a lapchart to try to make sense of all these numbers. If someone gets the all numbers, life for the lapchart person is easy. It's when some cars (or groups of them) get missed that this job gets fun. After the race, timing is also responsible for posting official results. This happens 30 minutes after the race, as long as there are no issues in tech or the stewards room. The last duty is to compile all of the results and make a book of results.

But who is the local timing and scoring chief? Well, that would be me, Kyle Colbey. I've just passed my 5 year annivesary of membership. In those 5 years, I have tried quite a bit that the club has to offer. I started with a few seasons in autocross before joining club race Timing & Scoring for the first time in 2010. Since then, I've tried to travel to other tracks and interact with other chiefs. It has certainly helped me learn the ropes quickly. After visiting a bunch of other tracks, I just had to try the driving for myself. I picked up a racecar in 2012, got my license and have been on track ever since. When not in the car, I usually can be found running around the timing room to help the event run smoothly. Race weekends are certainly not boring any longer. If you are ever interested in seeing what timing and scoring does for yourself, I would happy to have you meet (or join) the rest of the awesome timing and scoring crew that the region has.

Solo CAM Class

I may have already mentioned the new Classic American Muscle (CAM) class for Solo in a previous issue - but I wanted to touch on a bit more detail of the class and what is involved.

The purpose of the CAM class is to attract some potential new participants to Solo that drive "classic" cars (or trucks!) mainly from the "Big 3" American manufacturers that may not be setup to be competitive in many of the normal Solo classes.

The class is open to all street legal, licensed, and insured vehicles from US-based manufacturers that are able to pass tech inspection and weigh more than 3000 lbs. They should also be of a typical FR (front engine / rear drive) configuration.
