



My personal thanks to all of you, who have helped us this year to support the New Glen. This last month has been especially busy for the Glen Region, sponsoring three successful events in a row!



The Glen Region honored one of its longtime good friends, Mark Martin, maintenance manager for Watkins Glen International, at the Glen Race Circuit during the August Sprints. The ceremony took place during the Sunday lunch break on Pit Lane Island in front of Pit #1 with a large group of race personnel and friends in attendance.

Bob Burns, Glen Region RE, gave a short talk about Mark's involvement over the years at the race track. It began in 1953 when Martin and Son, Inc., of Burdett, NY, a road construction company that Mark's father, Harry, and he operated, were awarded the contract from the Watkins Glen Grand Prix Corporation. They were hired to make the necessary road repairs to the town maintained roads that made up the 4.6 mile course so that the 1953 Grand Prix could be held.

When the Grand Prix Corp. decided to buy land to build a permanent road course in 1956, it was Martin and Son that was the prime contractor hired to build the circuit. Mark continued to be involved at the track off and on in maintenance work until 1971, when he replaced Tom Viglione, as maintenance supervisor for the Watkins Glen Grand Prix Corporation. Today Martin is employed by Watkins Glen International, as their maintenance manager.

Bob Burns then presented Martin with a large wall plague and at the same time made him a life time honorary member of the Glen Region, in appreciation for his help over the years to the Glen Region.



With a break in the Glen racing season, the Editors traveled to Lime Rock on Labor Day weekend for the Continental Championship races, featuring Formula A and B. If those names don't ring a bell, let's say it was the L&M Championship for Formulas 5000 and Atlantic, before commercial sponsorship entered the picture. A/5000 race featured a spectacular duel between defending race champion, George Wintersteen, and local hero, Sam Posey, decided in Posey's favor by less than a car length, while Bill Gubelman topped Formula B.

We finally got our Elva Formula Junior on the full Glen circuit a couple of weeks later at the second annual Solo I. Fred Kepler set FTD against a field of 42, while Dick Robinson was well down the list after suffering a dragging clutch and a bug in the face.


